* One Top Fuel dragster 500 cubic inch Hemi engine makes more borsenower than the first 4 rows at the Davtona 500

*Under full throttle, a Top Fuel dragster engine consumes 1= gations of nitro methane per second; a fully loaded 747 consumes jet fuel at the same rate with 25% less energy being produced.

*A stock Dodge 426 Hemi V8 engine cannot produce enough power to drive the dragster's supercharger.

*With 3000 CFM of air being rammed in by the supercharger on overdrive, the fuel mixture is compressed into a near-solid

form before ignition. Cylinders run on the verge of hydrautic lock at full throttle.

* At the stoichiometric 1.7:1 air/fuel mixture for nitro methane the flame front temperature measures 7050 degrees F. * Nitro methane turns vellow. The sociacular white flame seen above.

each run costs an estimated \$1,000.00 per second. The current Top Fuel dragster elapsed time record is 4.441 seconds for the quarter mile (10/05/03, Tony Schumacher).

The top speed record is 333.00 mph (533 km/h) as measured over the last 66' of the run (09/28/03 Doug Kalitta).

Putting all of this into perspective:

You are riding the average \$250,000 Honda MotoGP bike. Over a mile up the road, a Top Fuel dragster is staged and ready to Bunch down a guarter mile strip as you pass. You have the advantage of a flying start. You run the RC211V hard up through the ears and blast across the starting line and cast the disaster.

The 'tree' goes green for both of you at that moment. The dragster launches and starts after you. You keep your wrist cranked hard, but you hear an incredibly brutal whine that sears your eardrums and within 3 seconds the dragster catches and passes you.

He beats you to the finish line, a quarter mile away from where you just passed him.

Think about it, from a standing start, the dragster had spotted you 200 mph and not only caught, but nearly blasted you off the road when he passed you within a mere 1320 foot long transporter.


