Acouple of Years ago – While we were sitting around drinking & partying at Wasson's – We came up with the idea for the 1<sup>st</sup> annual Mystery Tour. We needed to have a big BBQ, and might as well do a car show/cruise – or a "Mystery Tour". The rest is history... Well, the 2<sup>nd</sup> year was down a little on entries – but not the Fun!!!

WC Bob & I pre-ran the new tour course and came up with some interesting sites around the Riverside area. We changed a few stops this year so the tour was a lot different from last years – Thanks to the new stops:

# Bob Carroll's 1966 Chevy Impala SS

WC Bob found this car in April 2006 via a one-line ad on the internet social networking site MySpace. A few days later saw him in the hi-desert community of Apple Valley, and the next weekend dragging it home on a trailer. It sat with no motor/trans. for several months while plans were made for its' future.

Major disassembly began in July 2006, and soon it became apparent that it was to be a more extensive project than originally anticipated.

The front group was removed, and media blasting was commenced - soon a body panel professional and welder were brought in. The color was chosen, and Painter Mike laid on the SportTouring Red & Charcoal rallye stripes. After extensive research, it was decided that a 383ci SBC stroker motor was to power the rig, created by Mark Godfrey - backed by a 4-speed 700R4 transmission built by Mogi. It all spins a fortified 10-bolt reared massaged by Bill Thomas Engineering. Headers are by Patriot, mufflers Flowmaster and routed by DeAnza of Riverside.

Suspension is a custom combination of Chevy H-D, Classic Performance Products, Hotchkis, KYB & Micron Engineering. The 4-wheel disc brakes have drilled/slotted rotors, inspired by racing experience. The low slung stance covers 17" American Racing Hopsters, covered by BF Goodrich g-Force T/A's.

The interior was created by several different outfits, primarily Desert Sun Auto Interiors. The front seats were swapped out in favor of low back buckets from a mid-80's Camaro/Firebird, door panels replaced/ recovered and back seat rehabilitated. The stock dash just cried out for something custom - so arrangements were made for it to be manipulated to accept AutoMeter gauges to better match the Touring influences throughout. A VintageAir unit hides behind the cowling, as does an unbelievably well-designed Zoops serpentine belt arrangement. The total package is certainly an eye catcher.

Bob would like to first and foremost thank Uncle Larry of LAW Creations. This project would have never seen the light of day without you. In spite of his opinions and input - it's a wicked ride!





In 1994 two good friends (Dave Barnekow and Ron Speer) would meet at Dave=s hot rod shop on Friday nights, shoot the breeze and have a few beers. They decided to start a racing team as they were into Drag Racing for many years.

Being able to laugh at themselves they named it The Old Farts Racing Team thinking they would sign up a few good friends and have fun with their Hot Rods. Little did they realize what they had started.


The organization which is headquartered in the Inland Empire of Southern California has grown to around 1800 members as of August 2007 and keeps growing. The success of the organization is that there is no organization.

Every member is President (no bureaucracy). The organization is held together through a Hot Line and an tri-occasional newsletter to let the members know when, where and how. There are now members in 27 states plus Australia, New Zealand, England, Canada and the Netherlands. The organization is now mainly focused on producing five major car shows and several small shows for charity a year. The main show is Show and Go. A three day show held downtown Riverside, Ca. This show is sponsored by the Eastside Rotary Club of Riverside to raise money for their local charities. This show had 1000 plus cars entered for this May=s show.

This organization is called a Racing Team and it really has Race Cars in the organization. These include a NHRA Fuel Funny car, Sand Dragster, Crosley Dragster, Dirt and Pavement Stock Cars and Pro Street Drag Cars plus their own Retro Dragster still being built. There are now several well known names in the Hot Rod Community who are members of the Team and many many beautiful Rods, Customs and Classic cars in the membership...

To become a member of the Old Farts Racing Team there is one time fee of \$25.00. This provides you a T-shirt, sticker for your car News Letter and access to the Hot Line. There are no dues.

The object of the Racing Team is to have fun, never grow up, meet friends who love cars and help charity.



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RIVERSIDE - As he did throughout his life, pioneering hot rodder Phil Braybrooks will go on leaving his mark even in death. A lifelong hot rodder, a one-time speed-record holder and founder of the landmark J & M Speed Center in Riverside, Mr. Braybrooks will be buried in a coffin worthy of a speeding ticket and a man who dedicated himself to high-performance hot rods.

"His coffin is candy-apple red with gold flames on the side," said his wife, Pat Braybrooks. "He loved his hot rods."

Mr. Braybrooks, 77, died with his family in his Riverside home Thursday July 31, 2008 of congestive lung failure. He is survived by his wife, six children and five grandchildren.

Services are scheduled for 11 a.m. Wednesday August 6, 2008 at Crestlawn Cemetery, 11500 Arlington Ave.

An early champion of the drag-racing movement, Mr. Braybrooks helped build the region's hot rodding reputation and pioneered the concept of high-performance parts shops. J& M Speed Center is one of a handful of local performance shops to survive the era of online auto parts sales.

"Phil has been an icon in this business," said Tom Ameduri, owner of Hot Rods in Norco. "He was the first guy out here in the Inland Empire who brought performance parts to an actual storefront." He was famous in the industry and will be missed, Ameduri said. "Phil had a dry sense of humor and a straightforward manner," Ameduri added. "He spoke his mind and he earned the right to. Phil was here doing it before anybody else."



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Born in Orange in 1930, Mr. Braybrooks was hooked on hot rods from the beginning. He took a job in a muffler shop and once had to trade the hood of his car for gas to get to work. "He told himself then that he was never going to be that poor again," said Pat Braybrooks. "And he was very lucky to have made his fortune doing what he loves."

Mr. Braybrooks served as an aviation mechanic in the Air Force during the Korean War and came home to work at Lockheed Martin until he could save up enough money to open his own muffler shop in 1957, said Pat Braybrooks.

He began selling speed parts on the side and quickly found his side business more profitable than mufflers. He opened a speed shop in 1962 and moved to Riverside's auto mall in 1971.

In recent years, Mr. Braybrooks was inducted into San Bernardino's hot rodding hall of fame, and he received the Dale Earnhardt man of the year award, family members said.. "He worked Monday through Saturday for 50 years and spent his Sundays with his family," said his daughter, Lisa Somody, who now runs the family business.

As much a family man as gear head, Mr. Braybrooks took his children to Knott's Berry Farm on Sundays and planned family vacations full of horseback riding and water-skiing, said his daughter. He also doted on his grandchildren as much as his hot rods.

"He loved all of his grandchildren," said Pat Braybrooks. "They would all climb into his '29 Roadster and pretend they were at the drive-in, watching movies from the television on his workbench.

He will be missed by his family and the industry."



4 years? 5 years? We've lost count now -

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
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

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
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
