Old Farts Families that made this event happen. Without all of you and your efforts it wouldn't of happened.


Thanks to all the hot rods that came and participated in the event. The money that was made is a good start for the rebuild funds for Post 79.



## **Mystery Tour - Eibach Springs**



On an early September morning hot rod enthusiasts are gathering for the Old Farts Mystery Tour that will have three different routes involving six stops on each. Early that same morning myself and Jim Rosenberger arrive at one of the stops to set up and welcome the tour participants. The stop is "EIBACH SPRINGS" located in Corona, CA and Europe. We were met by Brad who is one of the supervisors.

Eibach Springs is a large production facility that manufactures springs and shock absorbers for vehicles of all shapes and sizes utilizing the latest in computer technology. On the shock absorber side of the operation they start with ten to fifteen foot lengths of various size steel tubes. Several operations and tests


later they have produced shocks of varying shapes and sizes ranging in size

for use on the family vehicle to all types of racing to huge commercial vehicles.

On the springs side of the operation they produce springs from the small size spring used in an ink pen to huge commercial springs. The springs start out as various thickness' of rolled coiled steel.

From this point the steel is formed, shaped and given a rated strength, then powder coated and labeled. Eibach Springs manufactures all the springs that are utilized in NASCAR Racing. Eibach is given the specs needed for the springs, they then manufacture the springs. Then during the NASCAR test week at Daytona Speedway the springs are shipped, along




with sending their engineers and production staff to work hand in hand with NASCAR to make sure the springs are up to the specs ordered.

Wednesday morning we headed out to registration to pick up our "goody bags", T-Shirts,







## **Mystery Tour - Ted's Rod Shop**






#### Dave Tucker Old Fart #2134

Dave joined the Old Farts a year and a half ago. He does not have a favorite food, guess he likes it all. He was born in Denver Colorado and moved to Riverside in 1946. He graduated from Riverside Poly in 1956. Dave worked for IBM for 11 years before starting a company called Synatck Co which made the original keyboard screens and computer word processors. A lot of them were used for the military guiding missiles. He retired when he was 51 years old. Dave was always loved fast cars and street racing. He even graduated with the original Old Fart, Dave Barnekow. In 1955 he helped start a car club called The Rum Runners with a bunch of friends. Parents did not like the name, and that made the young men more dedicated. Their rear window plaque was the first one

made at the same foundry that was used for several hundred other club plaques. In 1956 Dave got an award for the fastest car in Riverside. It had three carburetors and a magneto. He helped open Riverside International Raceway and got a lot of street drag racing going on there. He is a big time cruiser and still has the 1967 Chevy II SS that he special ordered brand new. It was parked in his garage since 1975 until he completely restored the car a year and a half ago. Dave is full of street racing and cruising history. If you get the chance to talk with him, believe me you will enjoy it.

Matt's favorite food is Chinese. He was born in Fontana but has lived in Riverside his whole life. He graduated from North High School in 1982. 
