He had just opened up Extreme Automotive in Corona and had very limited funds and found a set of racing seats for under \$100.00. When he went to put them in the car they were too big. With no additional money to spend he did what any car guy with no money would do, he got out the saws all and cut the car in half and extended the rear by 13 inches. Through the years Wild thing has gone through a few changes including paint schemes and engines. What started out as nothing turned it an awesome hot rod. The car is now candy red with flames done by Dave Wittle. Ron Mangus did the interior and if you know Ron's work then you know it is perfect! A Ford 9 inch rear end is under the back and disk brakes are in the front. The power plant is an Arias 610Cl aluminum engine. In 2005 Phil had a new idea of flames coming out of the zoomies. The search for the right fuel for this was scary. Every fuel was tried, gasoline, turpentine, alcohol, acetylene gas, lacquer thinner and acetone. Sunday is a day for us to get ready for the trophy presentation and a good day for cleaning Downtown





In the wake of such an unspeakable and senseless act of violence aimed at Law Enforcement, we lost one of our own and another greatly injured. During the whole ordeal, seeing the

loss and pain the families were going through, I sat in my garage watching the news, continued watching and finally had to turn it off because I was so sick to my stomach. I knew there was something we could do to help, but me as one person I couldn't do it all and I sent a late text to Denise Wasson Martinez, and she responded with "I was thinking the same thing right now!" We ran it by a few of the other members and the RPOA and had 100% backing for it and it was on!



We created the Flyer and printed off 2,500 of them and they were gone in 2 days and had to print another 3,000, next was the Facebook Page that reached a total of about 15,000 people, The Press Enterprise and Media Outlets as well. The Mayor of Riverside, The Chief of Police, RPOA and the River-




work for the days show, it was all coming together as planned!


When all said and done, We had about 350 Cars, 100+ Bikes and raised

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
Car of the Issue

Charlie Penunuri Old Fart#22





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



As the name "Old Farts Racing Team" implies; we're a mature lot who share a common interest in motorsports, right? Would it also be safe to as-



Growing up in Southern California in the fifties and sixties everyone had access to a drag strip. Here in beautiful downtown Riverside we had several strips at our disposal. I don't think there's anyone over the age of sixty that can't remember when we had Colton, Fontana and Riverside Raceway within a short drive running drags on a regular basis. Colton was probably my personal favorite. Safety wasn't a big issue in those days, everyone parked along the side of the landing strip at Morrow Field and watched the cars race. There was a rather brave fellow with a flag that stood in the middle of the track and started the races. Every now and then the races would stop so an airplane could land. The pits were probably the worst part of the facility. The surface was basically just blowsand and when you dropped something it sometimes took awhile to find it. I beieve Fontana was the first drag strip in the local area built strictly as a drag strip. The first time I saw it I was really impressed. They had paved pits, a fire-up road, and a rather primative starting light setup consisting of a red and a green light hanging over the track. It was pretty simple, when the light turned green you left and if you left too soon it turned red. The first "christmas tree" I remember seeing was at Riverside Raceway. Well, when the OFRT started most conversations ended up being about things that happened at the local tracks at one time or another. All of us had either raced or spectated at these tracks and had either been involved in or at least seen some wild things happen.
