Fleet Metal Box Turns 40 Years Old







Happy 2014 to all you Old Farts. It's hard to believe the OFRT will be twenty years old this June. Now for the really good news. Fontana Dragway will reopen in February with a new soundwall. The soundwall should keep all that pesky train noise out of the dragstrip. I hope this will keep the neighbors happy so we can have a local dragstrip once again. The schedule is posted on the Fontana Dragway website with more events to be added. One of the events already on the schedule is the Antique Nationals on June 29th 2014. It will be really cool to be back to one quarter mile racing as opposed to the one eighth mile at Irwindale we've ran the last two years. As most of you remember, the first outing we did as the OFRT was the Antique Nats at Los Angeles County Raceway in 1994. As you all know LACR was closed in 2007 and is now a gravel pit. LACR was probably the roughest and slickest track on the west coast, but it did have a lot of shutdown area, was close to home and just a really neat place to race. Carlsbad was also a neat old track. The shutdown area at Carlsbad was shortened several years before it was closed so you needed good brakes to go fast there. I think Carlsbad closed about ten years ago. So now, we will have the Barona 1/8 mile track, Irwindale 1/8 track and Fontana 1/4 mile track. I don't think we will lose Famoso any time soon and even though it is a long tow it is probably the best track on the west coast for the sportsman racer. Of course we still have Pomona which is probably the premiere drag strip on the west coast, but when you look at all the houses close to the track it makes you wonder how much longer it will last.
