Old Fartz Ride of the Issue



Jan Newman's Pro Street 56 Chevy

Upon retiring in 1994, from the California Department of Forestry and Fire (CalFire) Jan Newman went looking for a project car. He settled on a 1956 Chevy150, 2-door sedan, with a 12.5 to one compression, roller cam small block Chevy 350 engine and Muncie 4 speed.

But Jan wanted a more custom hot rod look. With the help of his son, Eric, owner of TED's Rod Shop, they began planning for the remake.


The first move was to Pro Street the car. Extensive engineering was required to tub it in order to get the Centerline Warrior 15 x 15 inch wheels and Mickey Thompson Sportsman 31-18-5-15 tires under the body. A major challenge was finding a way to keep the back seat (never know when the grand kids want to ride) and still have room for the wheel tubs. Room

was made for the wheels by cutting off several seat springs. (Who needs comfort!) The Pro Street look was awesome but Jan wanted more. He decided he wanted to lower the car (yes, a 56 Chevy lowered!). But he wanted to use air bags which no one was using at the time. They had to go to a motorhome dealership to find bags to use and improvise the set up.

The stress factor in the build was that Jan and Penny were leaving for a cross country cruise with Rod and Custom Magazine's AmeriCruise to Aspen, Colorado in less than one month. They finished the last of the work at 12:30am in time to leave at 6:00am to meet up with the group at Moon Eyes. Nothing like having confidence in your work!





The trip was great, no major problems and the car was a hit. We did have to carry a trunk load of Octane booster with us. People thought we were doing a commercial every time we opened the truck. One afternoon we returned to the car to find 20 guys, on their knees, ass-up, trying to see how we lowered the car and measure the size of the tires.

While offering the power he needed, Jan then set his eyes on a more gas pump friendly hot rod. He'd been reading about a new crate motor from Chevrolet and decided to order it – the first one in California! The crate motor finally arrived from Chevrolet's High Performance division – a Chevy 502 cubic inch. 510 horsepower Ram Jet multiport fuel injection. Again with Eric lending a hand, they installed

the engine and Tremac TKO 5 speed. Since the GM engineers never thought of anyone running a stick shift behind on of these motors, and since it runs on a computer, it took about a year of fine tuning – with the GM engineer sending out lots of replacement computers and finally flying out to set it up – he got it working great. It is now tuned to deliver over 600

horsepower! To top off the car, Jan had it painted with Porsche Red with flames from DuPont's in-house head painter. The car has been fun to drive and has taken Jan & Penny (usually with their dogs, Jiminy and Crickett) to Lincoln, Nebraska twice and runs to Yuma, northern California, Henderson and Havasu.





I raised the back of the frame in the center and spread the ramps apart at the rear, no problems, then i did the same at the front, raised the front by jacking under the engine cradle, went up just fine, I moved the right side out and then moved the left, I finished the move, as I let go, a small earthquake hit in San Bernardino, and I just watched it slide away from me.



But I got LUCKY, the core support tab went into the side of the tent and stopped it from hitting the concrete. in the pic above, it's perfectly balanced, actually teetering, but not moving. So i got a couple rugs and thick towels and put them under the corners, then i sat on 1 ramp and pulled it back onto the ramps, sliding on the rugs till back into position.




Big Sky's Big Shindig

Kind of like home, the fun-factor is here By Rotten Rodney


