

Just a small run down of what took place in the last 4 years. I am not going to mention any names of all the great volunteers that worked on the project just what has been done.




To start with we had to patch the roof where the water would just gush in then rip up the wood floors next to the windows, replace the floor joist, rebuild the wall, all

new windows & flooring, then off to the front door, when you would close it the walls would shake so it did no good to just replace the door we had to rebuild

the whole entry, moving right along to the mini bar we built a new one and just to the right of that one more wall to rebuild then off to the auxiliary room which was in shambles you could spit out the front window without opening it, you could push the wall




We got Dad's little T speedster finished up—a couple times now, actually. We'll be blowin' it back apart soon for engine number three. Then it's off to the races again.




