

Hot Licks in Cold Confines Reliving the Day We Didn't Explode

Don't know if y'all know this, but this writer don't ordinarily write for car club newsletters. Truth be told, however, a car club newsletter (this one) is where this writer's run actually began. Whether it's storytellin' or paintin' old hot rods in dangerous places, it's sort of refreshing to revisit the roots now and then.

Through the years I've worked in some well-equipped paint shops. I've also painted in some barns and chicken coops, so I'm not too spoiled to work in a friend's residential garage. If it's a tag-team flame job for example, Mrs. Rotten and I might travel.

Have y'all met our Montanan friends, Willie and Shawnna? Well, Willie has Shawnna's Model A coupe near finished, and it's lookin' mighty flammable.

As tech stories go, this'll be a little less-professional than usual. Our paint materials from stock are well-past their expiration dates, but we'll use fresh tape. Ordinarily we'd lay out one side and then pull a pounce pattern for oppo-



site-side symmetry. Although we've brought the tools and materials required we'll end up skippin' that step this time. From side-toside, it'll still be real close. On that note, let's just let 'er rip!

With the layout established in fresh 1/4-inch tape, the masking crew fills some gaps.



Here with static-cling plastic in place, masking is complete and Scotch-Brite chunks have been pushed around. Now let's splatter a mess on the nearest workbench.

We had to work for this, but we've managed to salvage some really old basecoat colors. A couple of these are actually from the 1990s.





Skippin' ahead, the first two colors are applied and blends are smooth. Now for the third color the spray pattern is pinpointed. Here my stunt double shades the hooks and tips.

Next, for this job, comes a single wetcoat of really old urethane clear. For this we'll want a warm garage, so the wood-burnin' stove is stoked.





You know, that big urethane cloud could be quite combustible. Here the only exhaust route is through the stove itself.

Now I don't exactly recall what's being said here, but this certainly has the looks of an impromptu safety meeting. Having somehow survived, I'd probably do it all again.



You name it—we flame it! When the overspray settles, we'll make a big ol' flaming tape ball to kick around outside—in the snow.

We made it to Colorado and stayed at Jim's friend, Lloyd Herman's place. Many years before, Lloyd was instrumental in Jim and his wife Jan's coming to the Lord. 


