opening the streets went really fast and very smooth. Just like the whole day.


A very big Thank You from Finn Comer, who we would not have show

Hi Guys.

I am proud to say, our monument building mission has come to an end. In a perfect world, I would tell you we would never have to add another name to the End of Watch list. Unfortunately, the world we live in is far from perfect.

Our mission started January 25, 2015. We built the first monument for the Fallen Officers of the Riverside Police Department. We did this under the direction of Commander Deno Blankenship. He had the idea to do something to honor Ryan Bonaminio, who was shot and killed November 7, 2010 in Fairmount Park. There were several others who jumped on board and sat on the committee, but the one person who took the lead was Ray Trosper, Veteran & OFRT Member. Ray needed a "monument builder" so he reached out to Steve Borden Sr., member of the SON's and OFRT. Between the two of them, they came up with what is now called the "Fallen Officers Memorial". Paul Arnold, Veteran & Retired RPD, with the help of others secured a date, January 24, 2015, to honor the fallen RPD killed in the line of duty. This was the start. Fundraisers were held. We were able to raise funds to build the monument. In the end we had money left over and donated it to the RPD. It was a great feeling to let Law Enforcement know that we stand with them, especially when you hear on the news about them being degraded.

A few years later, some of us SON's and OFRT members started thinking we could add something next to the Police Monument. Why not make a monument for the fallen Sheriffs of Riverside County. After all we already knew how to do it. Discussions were had. We decided, "Go Big or Go Home". End result, two more monuments. One for the RSD and one for the Riverside County CHP.

We honored the Fallen Officers of the Riverside County Sheriff Department on May 18, 2022. One year later, on May 22, 2023, we honored the Fallen Officers of the Riverside County California Highway Patrol. A lot of people donated money to both monuments. There were enough funds raised, we were able to put some back into the Legion. Some muchneeded work was done in the Dugout: paint, lights, and porcelain tile on the floors. Of course, we saved some money for the future upkeep and maintenance of the monuments. With the left-over money, we decided to donate it to the officers. \$5,000 was donated to the RSD and another \$5,000 donated to the CHP.

Hot Rod High

Hands-On Hope for Our Hobby

As it affects our beloved old car hobby, we're witnessing the decline of an essential element. Granted, collectors still collect. The auction action is alive and well. As usual, old cars are briskly bought and sold, but it seems as though there's less hands-on restoration work being done these days. For builders and restorers alike, it's gloomy to think related skills might not be passed along.



Apart from a few fine trade schools, the early-start vocational training that so many of us fondly recall is fading in favor of computer-based teachings. Rather sadly, exceptions are rare, but we do come upon them now and then.

Out here in Montana, Flathead High School continues to offer industrial arts courses. In one big old building students are honing their fabrication and mechanical skills. In the center of it all, there's even a paint booth in there!

As the Auto Shop teacher, Rob Hunter has been there well-over twenty years—and so has a class-project '28 Model A Tudor. We're told the project began quite differently, based on a '80s GM intermediate chassis. Through the years, however, it's been refined. In fact, as a result of student efforts it's showing great potential to be a nicely-finished hot rod.

The Tudor body is now at home atop a properly-boxed Model A frame, with a dropped 'beam axle and a 10-bolt GM differential bringin' up the rear. Its current engine and transmission are the basic 350/350 combina-

tion from a wrecked Chevrolet--all freshened up by students over time.

With Auto 2 and Auto 3 in session simultaneously each weekday, Mr. Hunter is spread-thin with an overflowing plate. For the hot rod project, students could use a little extra guidance. That's where the Glacier Street Rod Association (GSRA) comes in.

We think the number of supporters will grow, but at the time of this typewriting there are four GSRA members involved. Greg Greene, Mrs. Rotten, and yours truly are basically there as "rodding instructors" if you will. GSRA's Chris Martin (our NAPA parts store rep) has joined in as well, and NAPA's parts contributions have been enormously helpful. As a feel-good experience this is all quite-rewarding.

Now through the lens of the digital Brownie, let's have a look at the ongoing project. These'll just be random shots of flying sparks and flashing arcs, but through the haze you'll likely see it, too. From the looks of things

here, there'll be hands-on hope for our hobby after all.

Making use of Auto Shop's gantry crane, Mr. Greene is coaching students through the safe and proper removal of the project's existing rearend.



Here Mr.

Hunter gives initial instructions for the job at hand. The class will be replacing this rearend with a moredesirable positraction

assembly.

Just in from

out back, the next-up rearend is disassembled for visual inspection. With a little help from NAPA, this assembly will be rebuilt by students.





Following Mr. Greene's seal puller demonstration, the opposite-side seal will be pulled by students. These guys are already car smart, so they catch on quick.


Once it's stripped-down to an empty housing, students commence to cutting and grinding away unwanted spring saddles and sway bar brackets.



Here a new Panhard rod bracket receives a bit of necessary modification. Among this group of students we do have some proficient welders.

Then of course, when it comes to hot rod fabrication you can't have welding without a certain amount of grinding. Since the

new bracket will show, it'll need to look nice.





For this story's first installment, we'll conclude right here with coilover shock brackets, hairpin brackets, and the modified Panhard rod bracket welded in place.




